




Northern Waters Library Network

NORTHERN WATERS LIBRARY NETWORK PASSPORT

Visit libraries in the Northern Waters Library Network (NWLN) and you could win fabulous prizes! Here's how it works:

- Pick up a passport at a participating library or print one out from <u>www.northernwaters.org/passport</u>.
- Visit an NWLN library. Ask the library staff to stamp and date your passport.
- You may also include up to four library visits outside of NWLN in your passport. Just fill out their information in the blank spaces on the final page of the passport.
- Once you've visited ten libraries, ask an NWLN library for a prize entry slip. The library staff will mark off ten of your visits in your passport and give you an entry form.
- Fill out the prize entry form and return it to the library staff to enter the prize drawing.
- Continue visiting libraries for more chances to win!
 You can receive one entry for each 10 libraries you visit and mark in your passport.

- The Winchester town site is located on the northwest shore of South Turtle Lake, the largest lake in the Turtle Chain.

- Since 1957 there have only been three library directors: Ruth B. Tice, Susan Johnson and the current director. Donna Knuckev.
- The Winter Greenhouse is a travel destination for gardeners all over the Midwest.

27. WASHBURN PUBLIC LIBRARY

- Our library was built in 1905 and it was the first allelectric lighted building in town.
- May Greenwood was our librarian from 1898 to 1964, when she retired at 96 years of age. She was the oldest active librarian in the United States at the time.
- We have perhaps the most extensive collection of materials on Tom Blake available. Blake is a Washburn native who invented the hollow surfboard and is credited with making surfing possible for the general public.

28. LARSEN FAMILY PUBLIC LIBRARY

 Webster is located in the center of Burnett County, home to 508 lakes. We're known as the Sunfish capital of Wisconsin, and the world record "Jordan" buck – with a score of 206 1/8 under the Boone & Crockett Club scoring system – was shot in nearby Danbury in 1914.

- In our neighborhood is the Forts Folle Avoine Historical Park, an Ojibwe Village that offers insight into Ojibwe life during the time of the fur trade. Several museums, including a logging museum and one-room schoolhouse, showcase other aspects of Wisconsin and Burnett County history.
- The Gandy Dancer rail trail runs through Webster. The 47-mile stretch between Danbury and St. Croix Falls is a silent sport trail during the summer months.

5. **DRUMMOND PUBLIC LIBRARY**

- Drummond was originally a Rust-Owen Lumber Company Town. The Drummond Historical Museum is located inside the library and gives visitors a real sense of what it was like to live during the 1800's logging era in Northern Wisconsin.
- Home of the Drummond Dirt and Sno-Jacks Barstool Races on Presidents Day Weekend.
- Drummond is the largest Township in Bayfield County in the middle of the Chequamegon National Forest.

6. WALTER E. OLSON MEMORIAL LIBRARY

- Eagle River is known as the "Snowmobile Capital of the World" because of the World Championship Snowmobile Derby held there for over 50 years. There are over 500 miles of groomed snowmobile trails in the county. The World Snowmobile Headquarters and International Snowmobile Hall of Fame are located in Eagle River.
- The WI Hockey Hall of Fame is located at the Eagle River Sports Arena, a.k.a. "The Dome."

7. GRANTSBURG **PUBLIC LIBRARY**

- Hayward is an old logging town with historical and unique buildings such as the McCormick House, Angry Minnow, and the Freshwater Fishing Hall of Fame that features a giant musky landmark reaching four and a half stories tall.
- The library grounds include a half-mile nature trail around a pond with a StoryWalk® and a four-season audio guide. The trail connects with miles of trails on the hospital's property.
- The library also features sculptures inside and out by international artists Sara Balbin, Peter Toth, and Peter Ringheim.

- A trail that leads to the beautiful Lucius Woods County Park is located behind the library. The park includes an amphitheater, playground, beach with swimming area, picnic tables, and beautiful wooded areas to enjoy.
- The Little Gift House next door is a must-see shop with a variety of unique items and a coffee shop in the back. Make a day of your Monday or Thursday visit to Solon Springs by enjoying the library, lunch, and time in the park.

- Hurley's annual ATV Parade was recognized by Guinness as the world's largest, with 687 participants in 2005.
- In 1884, attorney M.A. Hurley won a lawsuit against the Northern Chief Iron Company. Instead of his usual fee for services, he requested that the town involved be named after him.
- Ralph Capone, brother of infamous gangster Al Capone, died in Hurley in 1974.

- From Iron River one can access thousands of miles of snowmobile trails and almost 200 miles of ATV trails. We are home to the Northern Pines Dog Sled Race.
- The library exterior features a mural depicting bygone Iron River Landmarks and the Blueberry Reader, a steel sculpture measuring 4' x 4' x 2'.







- The Ojibwe name for Madeline Island is Moningwanekaaning, "home of the yellow breasted woodpecker." Madeline Island is the spiritual center of the Lake Superior Chippewa, the Anishinaabe people. According to Anishinaabe history, the people were led there by Gitche Manitou, the Great Spirit, who told them to seek the place where food grows upon the water. The Ojibwe were here hundreds of years before European settlers.
- Our historical building was originally built as the Bayview School House in 1873 and was moved to its current location in 1960 when it became the library.
- The island library campus includes brand new indoor and outdoor makerspaces, a gazebo, a garden, a forest and a cozy meeting space we like to call "the living room."

18. **MERCER PUBLIC LIBRARY**

- The Mercer Library and Community Center was built in 1938 as a Works Progress Adminstration (WPA) project. Finnish builders from Michigan's Upper Peninsula were employed to construct the building using hand-hewn logs and traditional techniques.
- Mercer is known as the "Loon Capital" because of the high concentration of nesting loon pairs in the area, particularly in the nearby Turtle-Flambeau Scenic Waters Area.
- Mercer was home to the first wearable Smokey Bear costume, created in 1950 by staff at the Wisconsin DNR Mercer Ranger Station. You can see the first costume head on display at the Mercer Library.
